Although the two surviving Passions of J. S. Bach dominate modern performances, his fellow composer Georg Philipp Telemann penned over forty Passion settings during his tenure in Hamburg between 1716 and 1767. Through these imaginative and expressive musical settings of the Gospel story, Telemann aimed to uplift and inspire his audiences to live better lives. The beauty and immediacy of his music is as compelling today as it was in the 18th century. Don't miss this rare performance of his St. John Passion of 1737, featuring the exquisite voices of Exsultemus and Boston's most talented Baroque instrumentalists.
